As we come to the end of another academic year at NIA, we are incredibly thankful and appreciative of the hardwork, determination and resilience shown by both NIA students and staff in the face of such significant challenge. The students have certainly been a true credit to parents, carers, and the local community. We can be really proud of our school community for the way in which we have supported one another through the ongoing challenges, working together to ensure that we focus on doing everything possible to maintain the highest standards of education possible, both academically and for your child's personal development.

Over the past few weeks, we have concentrated on our Get Safe for Summer PSHE lessons which have included a focus on consent, bullying, knife crime and online safety. During Sports days students represented their houses admirably and demonstrated the very embodiment of our DNA: Collaboration, Respect, Responsibility, Care, Excellence and Aspiration.

Since our return to school post-Easter, we have invested significant time in re-establishing routines for learning and behaviour that have impacted positively on the atmosphere around the school building.

Moving to a new 3-period day timetable, challenging students to maintain high standards of uniform, attendance and punctuality are aspects of our focus that will remain paramount principles for the success of our learning community in the new academic year.

Wherever families have had difficulty with either uniform, or managing our expectations, we have endeavoured to support them productively with face-to-face meetings and daily check-ins. Expectations regarding uniform will need additional challenge, as you might expect in the new term.

- Skirts will need to be grey, knee-length and of a loose fitting, traditional style (Lycra/elastane 'fashion' style skirts are not permitted).
- Shoes will need to be plain black *school shoes* rather than sports' shoes/trainers of any type. They should be polishable and without sports' brand logos.
- Hair should be a natural colour. No bright/un-natural hair dyes will be permitted.
- Facial/body piercings must **not** be worn. Earrings are limited to one small pair of studs/sleepers.

Uniform mannequins have been installed in reception and the recent uniform update on the website makes it clear exactly what is and what is not acceptable in terms of dress. <u>https://nia.emat.uk/our-school/uniform</u>

You may be aware that House Ties are available to purchase from school directly via ParentPay, should you need to replace one. If you do not have a ParentPay account, please do contact school and a member of the team will support you in setting one up as we will essentially be 'cashless' from next term (apart from the PAYG lunch money machines).





Uniform is also available for purchase from The Schoolwear Shop NN1 4AA (01604 635828). If you make your order early in the holiday and your child/ren have a growth spurt during the break, you can be assured that they will accommodate your needs, rather than waiting until the end of the holiday to reserve the items you require, when you risk them running low on stock of more popular sizes. We are always happy to receive clean items of pre-loved uniform in good wearable condition. This helps us to support families in need and to cater for the inevitable mishaps that occur with uniform items during the normal wear and tear of the school day. Please bring any donations you might have to school reception. Blazers and ties are particularly appreciated – being either the costliest or most 'lost' items of uniform for students' families. Do remember to label items of clothing so that we are able to return them to their rightful owners if lost.
