The BTEC National Art and Design provides a practical, real-world approach to learning and develop specific knowledge and skills learners needed to work successfully in the Creative Arts sector. All units are set and assessed internally. So work is generated through practical projects, briefs, workshops and engagement with industry, preparing them through the development of portfolios and materials for progression.

Subject Combinations

Connected L3 courses

This course provides opportunity to develop a broader understanding of the Creative Arts sector, . The qualification can be taken as part of a diverse programme, leaving progression options fully open. It can give context to subjects that would benefit from some sector background. This will depend on the combination of qualifications chosen, for example if taken alongside BTEC National Enterprise and Digital Content Production.

Where can the Art and Design course take me?

In addition to the Creative Arts sector-specific content, the requirements of the qualification will mean that learners develop transferable skills, which are highly regarded by higher education providers and employers. Students can study degrees in a range of specialisms within Art and Design such as Fine Art and Graphic Design. Through a combination of practical experience and assignment briefs, these vocational qualifications provide level 3 learners with the knowledge, skills and understanding needed for a career in the Creative Arts sector.
