Re: Available support for children and young people and their families.

Following the tragic incident in Kingsthorpe on Wednesday, 22nd March, we recognise this may have caused shock and distress for many children and young people within the local schools and wider community. As such, we wish to let you know about the services and support that are available for children and young people and their families at this time, and over the coming weeks and months.

Social media

We know children have been communicating with one another online and appreciate this will offer a level of support to them as they come to terms with what has taken place. However, we do ask that people refrain from sharing insensitive posts and images on social media which are likely to cause additional distress.

How to report

Free2Talk

Free2Talk offer free weekly youth clubs across Northampton as well as online youth mentoring support. Professionals, parents and young people can get in touch directly via the website for further information, referral forms and direct contacts. An open-door policy will be operated throughout the Easter holidays for any young person seeking mentoring support or a safe place to talk.

Fearless

Fearless is the dedicated youth service of the independent charity Crimestoppers. They give young people the power to report crime 100% anonymously. They cannot track your IP address or your phone number and have no way of knowing who has contacted them. Fearless are not the police - they are a charity. You will not be contacted by the police after passing information on to Fearless as the police have no way of knowing who the information has come from.

Northamptonshire Police - Information on Knife crime

There are many misconceptions about knife crime and it's important to remember that the vast majority of people don't carry knives or get involved with knife crime. Northamptonshire Police are working hard with partner agencies and the communities within Northamptonshire to prevent knife crime from happening and to tackle those that do get involved with knife crime.

Knife crime is any crime which involves a knife whether it is used or not and some examples include:

- Carrying a knife
- Threatening someone with a knife
- Intending to hurt someone with a knife
- Using a knife to injure or kill someone
- Thieves carrying knives during a robbery or burglary
- The involvement of a knife or knives in gang-related offences
- Someone under 18 trying to buy a knife

If you are worried about someone you know carrying a knife, want to talk to someone about knife crime or ask advice please call 101 - always call 999 in an emergency such as when a crime is in progress and/or someone is in immediate danger.
