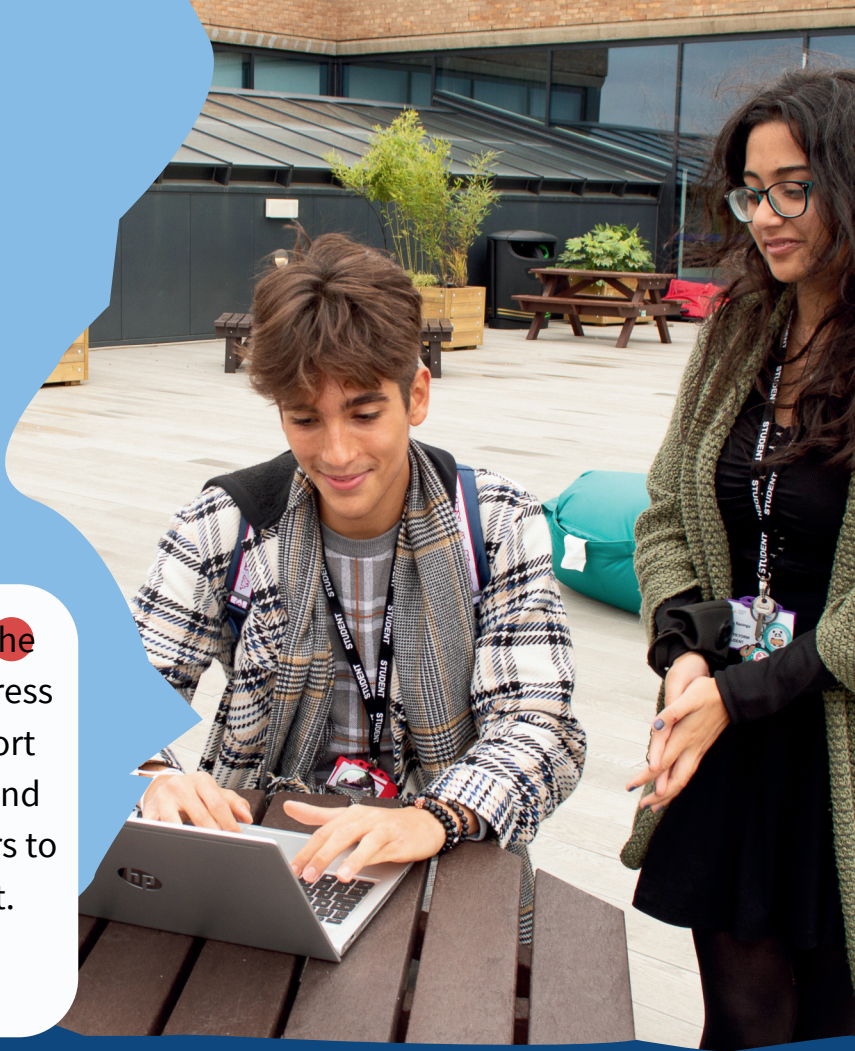




Sport



A BTEC in Sport will give the learners the skills and confidence they need to progress into a fulfilling, exciting career. The sport and fitness industry is always moving and changing, making it essential for learners to have the drive and resilience to adapt.

Assessment

Coursework and Exam
Continuous assessment

The BTEC First course in Sport provides a practical, real-world approach to learning and develop specific knowledge and skills learners needed to work successfully in Sport Industry. Internal assessment allows learners to develop a wider range of skills and provides evidence towards meeting the unit assessment criteria. Evidence for assessment can be generated through a range of activities, including role play, practical performance and verbal presentations. External assessment is in the form of a written paper and accounts for 25% of the final grade.

Subject Combinations

Connected L3 courses

This course provides opportunity to develop a broader understanding of the sports sector, including exploring sports events and an in depth look at sports health and fitness topics. In addition, it introduces a limited number of specialist areas and the opportunity to acquire some of the practical skills identified by employers as the fundamental building blocks for future competence in the workplace. The course combines well with the GCSE courses English Language, Maths and Science.

Progression

Where can the Sport course take me?

At all stages of their academic career, the practical base of a BTEC in Sport will help learners excel as team players, coaches and leaders of the future. The knowledge and skills you will acquire support progression to a broad range of level 3 study, whether academic or vocational, for example a BTEC National in Sport or a BTEC National in Applied Science or A Level Sport. Through a combination of practical experience and written assignments, these vocational qualifications provide level 2 learners with the knowledge, skills and understanding for a career in the Sport sector.
