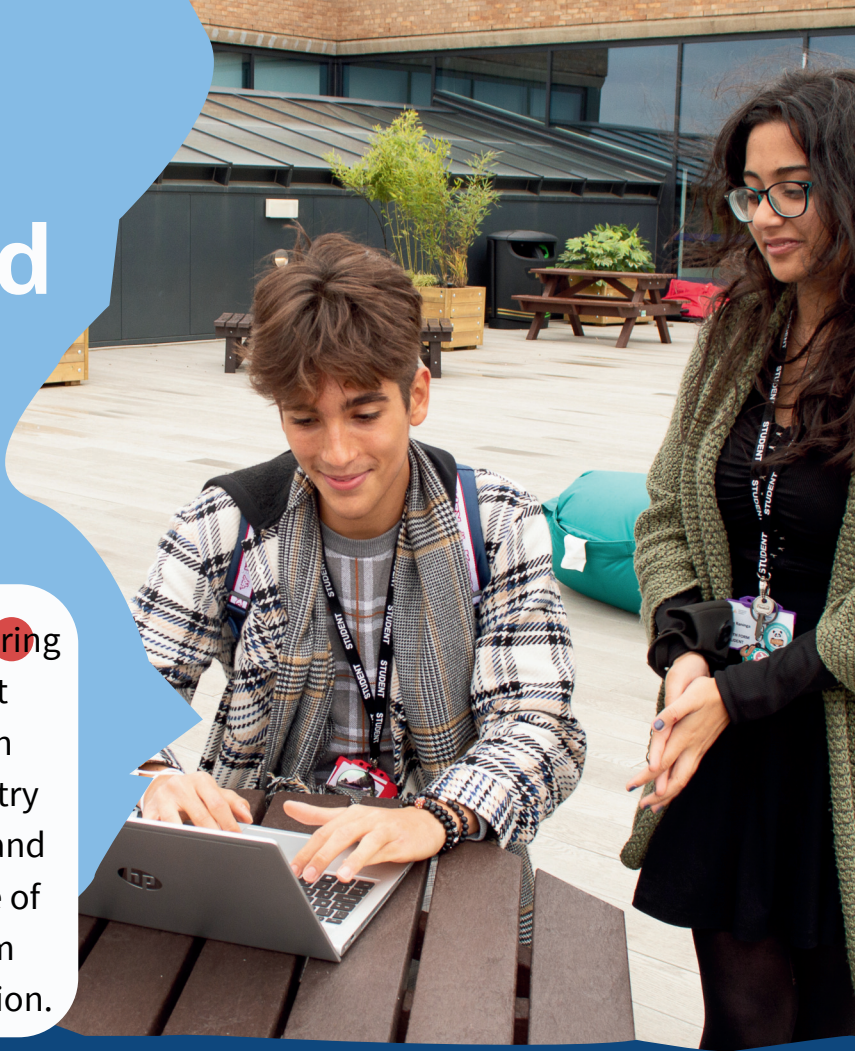




Hospitality and Catering

The BTEC First course in Hospitality and Catering provides a practical, real-world approach to learning and develop specific knowledge and skills learners needed to work successfully in the hospitality industry. Students are internally assessed on their ability to understand the key skills required to work effectively in the sector. This includes project management skills by running and planning an event such as a charity show. External assessment is in the form of a written paper and accounts for 25% of the final grade.

Connected L2 courses

Hospitality is a dynamic industry that responds quickly to changing market needs, through rapid growth, innovation and diversity. This enables the hospitality industry to offer many different types of employment, with opportunities for you to work in this country and around the world. Understanding the importance of customer service and working as an effective team member is an essential requirement for anyone who wants to work in a successful hospitality business. The course combines well with the GCSE courses English Language, Maths and Science.

Progression

Where can Hospitality and Catering take me?

The Hospitality and Catering course develops transferable skills such as team working, project management and communication skills.

Through a combination of practical experience and written assignments, these vocational qualifications provide level 2 learners with the knowledge, skills and understanding needed for a career in the sector: catering manager, concierge, chef or assistant conference manager.

This course can also lead to level 3 qualifications in Hospitality and Catering.
