


Stand Against Violence workshop: Gangs, Grooming & County Lines

Our sixth form students attended an impactful session delivered by **Stand Against Violence**, focusing on gangs, grooming and County Lines. The workshop supported students to explore the reasons individuals may become involved in serious and organised crime, the consequences and strategies to help young people avoid exploitation and seek support when needed.

Students were able to:

- Explain reasons some people may become involved in serious and organised crime
- Describe the far-reaching consequences of involvement
- Understand strategies to avoid exploitation and access support when needed



DebateMate workshop

This week our NIA6 students took part in an online debate workshop with DebateMate – they learned about the structure of competitive debating and how arguments can be presented. They enjoyed the session which created a strong competitive spirit between schools, and helped students to understand more about debate format, speaking structure and persuasive delivery.

“The debate workshop gave an educational and valuable insight to how competitive the school districts would be and how a debate functions between two parties...”

“I enjoyed the competitive nature between schools and how the structure of debates was given in order to allow students to gain a full understanding...”

“On the 14th of January we received the opportunity to debate against many other schools... topics included whether protests are the most effective means of change, whether students should have 4-day weeks, and a ‘survival of the fittest’ exercise... speeches got heated and it showed us how each individual persuades others...”


Well done to all students involved — you represented NIA6 superbly!

November resits success

A huge WELL DONE to those students who took resits in November. An AMAZING 70% of students gained a 4 or above in English and 29% of students gained a 4 or above in Maths - these are both significantly higher than the national average, particularly in English. Several students saw a significant improvement in their grades, including going from a 3 to a 6 in English, a 3 to a 7 in English and from a 4 to an 8 in English.
