The BTEC National in Travel and Tourism provides a practical, real-world approach to learning and develop specific knowledge and skills learners needed to work successfully in Travel and Tourism Industry.

There are 2 types of assessment: Internal assessment allows learners to develop a wider range of skills and provides evidence towards meeting the unit assessment criteria. External assessment is in the form of a written paper and accounts for 25% of the final grade.

Subject Combinations

Connected L3 courses

This course provides opportunity to develop a broader understanding of the Travel and Tourism sector, including exploring industry trends.. The qualification can be taken as part of a diverse programme, leaving progression options fully open. It can give context to subjects that would benefit from some sector background. This will depend on the combination of qualifications chosen, for example if taken alongside Btec National Enterprise and A Level History.

Progression

Where can the Travel and Tourism course take me?

In addition to the Travel and Tourism sector-specific content, the requirements of the qualification will mean that learners develop transferable skills, which are highly regarded by higher education providers and employers. Through a combination of practical experience and written assignments, these vocational qualifications provide level 3 learners with the knowledge, skills and understanding needed for a career in the Travel and Tourism sector.
