Year 13 Mock Exams in November

- Very mixed results.
- Some classes had the benefit of being shown the questions before they took the exams. This enabled excellent preparation and gleaned some fantastic results **BUT** it's not a realistic experience.
- Highlighted specific areas needed for revision for each student and the need to work on exam technique.



Post-18 Applications

Predicted Grades

These are a reflection of the progress made and expected based on:

- Mock results
- Coursework
- In-class assessments
- Exam practice (independent and in class)

As a rule of thumb, predicted grades tend to be one grade higher than mock grades.





JCQ is the Joint Council for Qualifications.

They set the rules and regulations for all exams and qualifications in the UK.

If these rules are not followed, candidates are disqualified from the exam and, in some cases, the qualification. In some instances, all candidates sitting the exam are disqualified if the exam board feel the integrity of the exam has been compromised.



Warning to Candidates

- 1. You **must** be on time for all your examinations.
- Possession of a mobile phone or other unauthorised material is not allowed even if you do not intend to use it. You will be subject to penalty and possible disqualification from the exam/qualification.
- You must not talk to, attempt to communicate with or disturb other candidates once you have entered the examination room.
- You must follow the instructions of the invigilator.



- You must not sit an examination in the name of another candidate.
- You must not become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice in any part of the examination.
- If you are confused about anything, only speak to an invigilator.

Key Messages for the Mocks

- 1. Period 1 exams start at 9am you need to be here and ready to go into the exam room by 8:45am.
- 2. Period 2 exams you need to be lined up at 10:55am ready to go in at 11:00am.
- 3. Period 3 exams you need to be lined up for 12:50pm ready to go in at 12:55pm.
- 4. If a period 3 exam runs into tutor time, you will be dismissed from the exam rooms at the end of the exam.

Remember:

- No phones or watches on your person.
- No communication with anyone other than the invigilators from lining up beforehand to leaving the exam area.
- Follow all the invigilators instructions immediately and exactly.
- Clear pencil case. Calculator (no case). Water bottle (see through, no label, only water).



Steps to Success at A-Level

In school, every day, on time to bank hours of learning.

Lessons

6 lessons a fortnight per subject 30 hours a fortnight in lessons

Independent Study

10 hours per fortnight for each subject 20 hours of study per fortnight are built into your timetable, the rest should be at home

Remember, you will cover most topics only once – learning first time round is the key to success!

If you've got gaps from last year or joining late, you should be attending revision classes and speaking to your teachers about areas to revise or resources to catch up.



6-Weeks to Success Plans

- Weekly specific tasks for each lesson.
- 2 hours of clearly directed independent study for each subject.
- Completion of tasks checked and signed by subject teachers each week.
- Improvements in outcomes.



Notes for Success

- Students need organised notes for all their subjects.
- Folders and assessment trackers were given out today in assembly.
 - Staff: can check student notes and evidence of wider reading and give relevant, immediate feedback.
 - Students: can immediately see areas where their notes won't adequately prepare them for lessons and exams and set personal targets for improvement.
 - Parents/Carers: can track their child's progress in each subject and see what additional work is required at home.
